



Objective: The objective of the session on the "CAPITALINE DATABASE" was to familiar is e first-year MBA students with the functionalities and applications of the Capitaline database. The session aimed to equip students with essential skills for extracting and utilising financial data effectively, fostering a deeper understanding of corporate finance and analysis.

Write up on the Programme:

Kristu Jayanti College's Library Resource Usage Optimisation Committee, in collaboration with the School of Management, was delighted to organize a session for the first-year MBA students on the *CAPITALINE DATABASE* by Mr. Gurumurthy G, Assistant Manager, Finance, Capital Market Publishers India Pvt. Ltd., Bengaluru. The session took place on October 8, 2024, from 4:30 PM to 5:30 PM and was coordinated by Dr. Anandraj J.

The session provided a brief overview of how to extract and use data in the simplest way using "CAPITALINE-AWS." The resource person underlined that *Capitaline* was an indispensable tool for finance professionals offering exhaustive information, including historical financial data at the schedule level, shareholding patterns, share pricing data spanning 10 to 25 years, corporate announcements, financial news, press releases, and alerts. It allows users to acquire the financial data of a company during any timeframe in one snapshot on a screen.

Mr. Gurumurthy emphasized how an annual report is prepared, detailing the six components: the Auditors' Report, the Board's Report, Management Discussion and Analysis, Financial Statements, the Board of Directors, and the Chairman's Statement. He explained how to obtain company details while searching for financial data and discussed the corporate governance





structure, which emphasizes transparency and ethical business conduct. He also provided information on dividend releases by different companies.

Additionally, he demonstrated how to compare and analyze the financial performance of companies over different years using charts and sector-based comparisons. He provided insights on using screener data, how to select companies based on their domain and price, and how percentage changes in data can be easily acquired. Screener data offers financial performance data of any company for up to 25 years, and it can be modified to suit specific needs, such as for 10 years or 5 years and finally Mr. Gurumurthy detailed how data can be easily extracted and used in Excel.

The session enabled students to gain valuable insights into the various financial services and information provided by CAPITALINE-AWS, aiding in the analysis of financial performance and comparison of data across various domains.

Learning Outcome:

By the end of the session, students learned several important concepts and skills related to the Capitaline database. They gained an understanding of the database's structure, features, and the types of data it provides. Students learned how to efficiently extract financial data using "CAPITALINE-AWS" and how to analyze and compare the financial performance of companies across different sectors and timeframes through data visualization tools, including charts. They recognized the key components of an annual report and understood their significance in terms of corporate governance and transparency. Furthermore, they learned how to utilize screener data to select companies based on specific criteria, such as domain and price, and interpreted percentage changes in financial data. Finally, they acquired the ability to extract and use data in Excel for practical applications, enhancing their overall analytical capabilities in finance.

Interactive Element: Mr. Gupta concluded his session with multiple choice questions related to Manupatra, which were insightful and encouraged active participation and engagement from the audience.






Outcome:



Outcome:










Outcome:






