Kristu Jayanti College, Autonomous, Bengaluru is an embodiment of the educational dreams of St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara (1805-1871), the founder of the religious congregation, Carmelites of Mary Immaculate (CMI). He envisioned the sunrise of a renewed humanity through the integral development of mind, body and spirit. The motto of the college, Light and Prosperity, aims at this synthesis and the harmony of the spiritual and the physical, the mind and the body. The curriculum and the co-curricular activities are the basic structures acting as springboards to step into the mystery of human life and beyond.

Kristu Jayanti College was reaccredited by NAAC with 'A' Grade in November 2015 and is an Autonomous College under the Bangalore University. The programmes of the college are imparted through three deaneries: Sciences, Humanities and Commerce and Management. The college offers 13 degree programmes, 12 Post Graduate programmes, 3 Post Graduate Diploma programmes and 2 research programme centers [Social Work and Biotechnology]. The college is recognized by UGC under the categories 2(f) and 12 (B). The academic programmes of the institution are based on an annual theme. The theme chosen for the current year is *“Wellness through Academic Enrichment”*. The programmes organized strive for the academic enrichment and holistic wellness of students by inculcating the necessary knowledge, skills and values.

The total number of students in the academic year **2017-2018 is 4,869** representing all the states in the country with **53% of girl students and 29% of SC, ST and OBC students**. There are 38 foreign students from 13 nationalities pursuing regular programmes in the institution. There are 176 faculty members, 52 administrative staff, 24 support staff are pivotal in the proficient functioning of the institution and foundation of the college's success.

1. ACADEMIC EVENTS ORGANIZED IN 2017-2018

The institution believes that learning and personal growth, in and outside the classroom, is continuous in nature. The departments of the college have actively engaged the learners through **a total of 457 academic programmes**, interactive, experiential and constructivist learning programmes.

It is indeed enlightening to note that there were **5 international conferences, 22 national conferences, 28 Institution level Interactive Programmes and International Lecture Series** organized by the Departments of Commerce, Life Sciences, Kannada, English, Journalism, Management, Management Studies, Computer Science UG and PG, Economics, Social Work, Psychology, Women Empowerment Cell and IQAC.

512 Resource persons have interacted with students and Faculty members in this year, which includes 271 inspiring industry experts and 241 outstanding academicians, scientists, artists.
