

The winners of the Kite Flying Competition and Culinary and Cultural Expo were given prizes and certificates by the chief guest, Mr. M.M Yaseen.






Dept. of Kannada celebrated Kannada Habba (Kannada Fest) on the above date.

Kalajyothi, the Intra Collegiate Literary, Cultural and Gospel fest, is conducted for the students from various departments in UG where they get together and showcase their talents and win prizes. Kalajyothi was conducted from 11th July to 16th July 2016. Kalajyothi 2016 was declared open by The Principal, Rev. Fr. Josekutty P.D. The Chief Guest for the occasion was Mr. Balaji Iyer, Associate Director and KM Leader, Grant Thornton LLP.

46 events were conducted under the categories of literary, fine arts, theatre, music and dance in which 1,437 students participated.

dances, tableau, mime and skit, during the cultural program between 2.30 to 4.30 PM in the main auditorium.


