The students of Tourism had exhibited more than 300 varieties of ethnic dishes within their span of 50 stalls. Students from B. A (Tourism) and B.Com (Tourism) participated and all the 50 stalls had a theme pertaining to a state, type of food or related to the team members' ethnicity.

Stalls are based on a particular place or communities' food items, and 244 students from the tourism department actively participated in the fest. The students were divided into groups. There were approximately 50 stalls, which were set on different themes. Each stall consisted of 4 students and they bought traditional homemade food items for the exhibition. The students dressed up in traditional outfits based on the selected theme and this made the stalls more attractive. The stalls had many write-ups, souvenirs and handicrafts which captured the attention of the audience.

There was a panel of four judges to evaluate the performance of the students based on various criteria. Yaan 2017 also had a stall exclusively for Tibetan food items which secured second place in the competition. The winners were declared and awarded at the valedictory function of

YAAN 2K17. The criterion for the winning teams consisted of Stall setup, Ethnicity, Food items and so on.




