Dr. Irona Bhaduri is an Assistant Professor of English at Kristu Jayanti (Deemed-to-be University), Bengaluru. She holds a Ph.D. from Central University of Rajasthan, an M.A. in English and Comparative Literature from Pondicherry University, and an M.A. in Sociology from IGNOU. A recipient of the UGC-NET-JRF award, she has also worked as a Talent Acquisition Analyst at Dell Technologies, where she integrated professional communities. Her research focuses on marginality studies, cultural studies, gender studies, Southeast Asian literatures, and Tagore Studies. Her work engages with transnational cultural narratives, exploring critical questions of gender, culture, marginality, and memory. Notably, her doctoral research involved pioneering interviews with authors, theorists, academicians, and journalists. She has presented at national and international conferences, contributed to reputed journals and book chapters, and served as a reviewer for Q1 Scopus journals such as the International Journal for Educational and Vocational Guidance (Springer) and the Athens Journal of Humanities and Arts. She is a member of ELTAI, Muse India, and MELOW, and has served on editorial boards, chaired conference sessions, and published extensively with presses including Columbia University Press, Springer, and Routledge.
