Using comparative and transnational approaches, her work highlights connections and tensions between host and home cultures. Her research contributes to uncovering marginalized voices, broadening the literary canon, and deepening understanding of global migration narratives. Her interdisciplinary approach bridges literature with sociology, history, postcolonial studies, and cultural studies, enriching discourse on globalization, identity politics, diversity, and representation.
