

Bank of India has moved progressively to a for-ward looking framework for early detection of risks, and timely/appropriate supervi-sory interventions in the fi-nancial sector, said Deepali Pant Joshi, Executive Director,

Already, 36 banks are being supervised under this frame-work, she said while speaking at a symposium at the Kri

The RBI, she said, has also revised the regulatory frame-work for NBFCs (non-banking finance companies), whose NPA (non-performing asset) norms will now be aligned with those of banks in a phased manner.

was rolled out.

mancial indicators triggering granular investigations is being put in place," she added.
As part of its global initiatives, the RBI, she said, has executed 26 MoUs, one letter for supervisory co-operation and one statement of cooperation with supervisors; regulators abroad.

Joshi said that the current re-cessionary trends in ad-vanced economies and the volatility in the stock and cur-

rency markets due to the de-valuation of the Chinese yuan pose a risk to long-term growth of the economy.

Printing of notes According to Joshi, the Re-serve Bank has embarked on a serve Bank has embarked on a multi-pronged strategy for the indigenisation of currency note printing, keeping in view the associated benefits of backward integration in the form of assured, smooth and timely supply, cost saving (by way of lower import bill), employment generation and effective deterrent to counterfeiting.

A paper mill is being set up in Mysuru, with an annual capacity of 12,000 tonnes, which will substantially meet the paper requirement for

the paper requirement for currency printing.

Bengaluru: Indian Railways Catering and Tourism Corporation (IRCTC), one of the largest e-portals in India with millions of users logging in every day, will soon start selling hand-made products procured from rural women online, railway minister Suresh Prabhakar Prabhu said on Monday.

"Indian Railways is keen to engage society in its in-novative works. While we have already involved a number of public communities and NGOs under our cleanliness drive, we are also encouraging self-help groups of rural women to manufacture products that the railways will sell online through its web portal. The products will range from traditional food to handicrafts, shawls and other ethnic dresses. We have already asked women from Kashmir and the northeast to be a part of our initiative, and will soon start selling their products," Prabhu said during an interaction with 4,000 graduates and under-graduate students of Kristu Jayanti College

cialization of indigenous, hand-made products. "However, for attaining that level, we will never stoop low and sell doormats and shoes with the tricolour on them," said Prabhu, alluding to the recent controversy over Amazon selling doormats featuring the Indian national flag on its Canada website.

The minister said the Rs 50 crore allocation made towards innovation in last year's railway budget included the idea of e-commercialization of indigenous products, e-catering service, renovation of 400 stations and introduction of super-bullet trains. "We are trying to get more allocation for railways

in the coming budget so that all this work can be done faster," he said, adding that the government is trying to increase the allocation to railways to Rs 4 lakh crore in the next three years.

Stressing on complete electrification of railways to avoid use of diesel and curb pollution, he said the railways is trying to get 90% of its trains to run on electricity in a few months.

"Soon, we'll come up with a transformation office that'll implement crowdsourced ideas. In another five years' time, 400 stations across the country will be renovated and will look like five-star airports."

Demonetisation had many pluses too: Ex-RBI Deputy Governor

Stopping tax evasion and a push towards the digital mode were the unannounced objectives behind demonetisation, said Rama Subramaniam Gandhi, a former Deputy Governor of the Reserve Bank of India.

Addressing students at the 34th edition of 'Vichaarmanthan', an interaction with global visionaries, at Kristu Jayanti College, Bengaluru, Gandhi said the other objectives were to eliminate black money, fight against counterfeit notes and end financing of criminal activities.

Demonetisation also addressed the generation of black money, which happens mainly through real estate, jewellery, and benami transactions.

"While the process of demonetisation was on, there were negative and positive impacts, some of which were like negative influence on the economy for a short tenure. For instance, reduction in GDP of the country," said Gandhi.

"But tax compliance increased which helped in the decrease of tax rates in the medium to long term. The de-

celeration of economy took place and cash-based economy was affected but the number of tax payers increased," he added.

On the challenges faced by the central bank in demonetisation, Gandhi said it was done to limit the generation of black money and counterfeiting of notes.

"There are three types of counterfeiting - crude counterfeiting, which is easily identifiable and uses cheap measures; one that uses modern equipment to photocopy notes, and state-sponsored counterfeiting, which is used as a tool to distort peaceful proceedings in a country. Now, after demonetisation, the newly issued currency notes are different in size compared to the old ones. They are better in quality."

'Protectionist G20 push

The rise of protectionism among G20 countries is pushing up tariffs on exports, thus slowing down global trade, said Michael Debabrata Patra, Executive Director, RBI.

"The biggest engine of globalisation is global trade, which is now under threat due to protectionism. It drastically slows down the global economy and prevents further growth," said Patra at Kristu Jayanti College here.

Talking about the lingering effects of the global financial crisis of 2008, he said: "The period 2000-07 was considered the golden era for the global economy. But the financial crisis of 2008 was the worst since the economic depression of 1930.

capital flows virtually vanished and bank lending reduced drastically."

Quicker recovery

However, India recovered comparatively sooner from the collapse due to strategically encouraging foreign investment, he said. India has a vast reserve and could potentially hold its own in the case of another crisis, he added.

World economies are slowing down due to growing number of old people. However, India with a young population, with an average age of 26 years, bucks this trend, he said, adding: "We still have a lot of time to grow."

"India contributes to about one-seventh of the world growth, thus it is estimated that by 2030, India will over-


