Speaking at the event, Dr. Bhagyavana Mudigoudra, Special Officer, E-Governance, Department of Higher Education, Bengaluru, stressed

that innovation should not only solve problems but also "shape a better humanity." Urging students to seek meaningful solutions to real-world challenges, he quoted 12th-century mystic poet Allamma Prabhu, encouraging participants to "break the existing path and create a better one.' He reminded students that coding and technological skills are tools for shaping the future, and emphasized the importance of persistence, curiosity, and passion in achieving success.
