State govt for systematic implementation of NEP: Dr Ashwatha Narayana



The government will focus on systematic implementation of National Education Policy-2020 (NEP-2020), Dr.C.N.Ashwatha Narayana, the minister of Higher Education, stated on Wednesday.

On inaugurating the national seminar, "Implementation of NEP 2020- A Road Map" organized by Kristu Jayanti College (Autonomous) in association with Bengaluru North University, he said, the real empowerment of the society can only happen based on the appropriate education system for which the NEP aspires.

The National Education Policy-2020 has the objective of providing the right kind of education, aims to develop well-rounded future citizens. and upholding the rich heritage of the country. The economy could thrive only through knowledge, innovation, scientific and technical

progress, he explained. Narayana pointed out, "The government will focus on systematic implementation of NEP and seeks CSR funds from industry and donations from organizations towards





this. The NEP strengthens the education system by eliminating the previously existed rigidities, granting autonomy to institutions and becoming more flexible."

P.Pradeep, The Commissioner, Dept. of collegiate education, told, the real essence of the NEP-2020 lies in awarding freedom to students and there will be no hard separation between arts, humanities, science subjects. In this way, the policy enables multi-disciplinary learning.

Saying, that, NEP aspires to empower students by enhancing their skills & ability and giving importance to Health & Wellness, he added, The National Skills Qualifications Framework (NSQF) aligned Curriculum, Scientific pedagogy, qualitative assessment, and adaptability of the system will pave way for preparing students to become globally competitive.

Transfers only through Counselling as mandated by law: Health Minister Dr K Sudhakar

Health Dr.K.Sudhakar in an order issued on Wednesday has directed to make counselling mandatory for transfers of medical officers and other staff in the state health and family welfare department putting a break to arbitrary transfers that were happening round the year through recommendations and other corrunt practices.

This decision will enhance transparency and efficiency in the functioning of the department and improve delivery of healthcare services to citizens preventing arbitrary transfers based on recommendations and lobbying.

How it will be implemented

The Karnataka State Civil Services (Regulation of

Transfer of Medical Officers and other Staff) Act'. 2011 provides that all transfers of medical officers and other staff in the health and family welfare department must happen though suncelling The

to be brought to the notice of the minister.

No other transfer proposals should be taken up. In case if anyone violates the order, all concerned staff will be subjected to strict departmental disciplinary action, Minister Dr.K. Sudhakar warned in his

Employees who are battling serious illness, who are on the verge of retirement, those who have less than 2 years of service, those who are 40% or more physical handicap, widows, husband and wife mutual transfer and other such special cases based on humanitarian grounds will be considered for transfer only once in 2 months and the act will also be recommended accordingly, said minister.

The Act regarding transfer has been passed in 2011 and rules also have been framed. The act has also been amended once in 2017. Going forward all transfers will be conducted as per the provisions

of the law. This decision will not only ensure transparency and discipline in transfers of medical officers and other staff but also prevents corruption and arbitrary transfers which negatively impact the functioning of the department and delivery of healthcare services to the people, Dr.Sudhakar said in his tweet.

What does the rules sav?

Senior specialists, specialists, deputy chief medical officer, senior medical officer, general duty medical officer, chief dental health officer, senior dental helath officer, dental

health officer can be transferred by commisioner of the department. Group B. C. and D staff can be transferred by Department Director and the same applies to AYUSH Department.
