



College category: Only two state institutions in top 100

Some Private Institutes Say Parameters Loaded Against Them

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Bengaluru: Karnataka's colleges have not fared well in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) 2022 rankings released by the ministry of education even though state higher educational institutions figure in top 100 in good numbers when it comes to other categories.

In the 'colleges' category, MS Ramaiah College of Arts, Science, and Commerce has bagged the 55th rank (best in state) and St Joseph's College of Commerce 93rd.

NIRF RANKINGS

Karnataka colleges in the band of 101-150 ranks are Kristu Jayanti College, Bengaluru;

St Aloysius College, Mangaluru and St Joseph's Arts & Science College, Lalbagh Road, Bengaluru. Many top colleges from the city have been missing from the NIRF list, year after year. Private colleges say they are at a disadvantage in terms of parameters like student profile, teacher qualifications and filling of seats.

“Colleges with a large number of students from the lower social and economic bracket score better. Therefore, many government colleges get an upper hand. The rankings also look at the number of teachers with PhD and NET. Unlike in a government/aided college, private colleges might not follow this. This affects the student:teacher ratio, and many colleges tend to drop teachers without PhD in the list. Unlike a government college, all seats might not get

filled in a private college,” said a professor from a top Bengaluru college.

“It is disappointing, but we do not believe in it much either as these are only statistical measures provided by the college,” she added.

Many educationists question the authenticity of the NIRF rankings. “The data is not validated. It is just self-reported information and there's merely sample checking of sample institutions. It is a popularity contest of institutions, not a quality contest. If you believe that beauty contests are done to find the best human beings, then go ahead,” said an official working with University Grants Commission. Some say many colleges take the help of agents for data management for rankings.

A faculty member of a Bengaluru institution that improved its score drastically said there were consolidated efforts to up the ranking. “Conscious strategies/policies were

developed and investments made. We ensured that admissions were made from various parts of the country to improve regional diversity. The number of scholarships was increased. Extra efforts were made in documentation, data management and presentation of data,” said the faculty member.

A faculty member of another college pointed out that private colleges in Bengaluru do not have as much autonomy as those in Chennai or Delhi. “The government interferes in matters of private colleges. The imposition of the language policy through NEP and admission through UUCMS are examples. If not the government, universities intervene. Take the case of Srishti School of Design and Technology. What academic freedom are we talking about,” he asked.

Those involved in the process say it's tedious work. “The process is scientific and the parameters used are credible. The challenge for us is that we

are a single discipline college. Perception ranking parameter of NIRF is a challenge too as we do not know whom they are surveying,” said Nirmala Joseph, associate professor, St Joseph's College of Commerce.

“This calls for a lot of clerical work. To be involved in this exercise is not easy for teachers. Under student progression, one needs to track students graduating from colleges. Only full tuition fee waiver scholarships are considered. However, institutions like ours believe in giving partial scholarships to a larger number of students who are in need. We find it very difficult to get details of government scholarships. This data collection is tedious work that many colleges do not want to invest in. But we enjoy doing it,” she added.

“The rankings are for documentation purpose and that's why many do not take them seriously,” said the principal of a popular college.

SILVER JUBILEE INTERVIEW: FR DR AUGUSTINE GEORGE, PRINCIPAL, KRISTU JAYANTI COLLEGE

“We Plan to Work on 25 New Areas”

Kristu Jayanti College (Autonomous) has completed 25 years of its journey as an institution of higher education. Nestled in the north-eastern sector of Bengaluru, the college has witnessed tremendous growth in terms of student numbers, faculty, courses and infrastructure. **Principal Fr. Dr. Augustine George**, in an interview with *News Trail*, highlights the advanced needs of learners and says he would like to go beyond the barriers of traditional models of education by focusing on progressive quality research, innovation and by addressing social issues. Here are excerpts.

How does it feel to have reached the milestone of the silver jubilee success for the institution?

We are in the 25th year of the institution's progress. The college started with nine students and now we have 12,000 students in the campus. I don't believe in numbers alone, but look at the education system built over the years. The kind of culture and ethos we have fostered in students with innate practices and the excellent resources we hold distinguishes us from other institutions. The value system and the unique culture are very evident in the attitude of our students, faculty members and stakeholders. It is certainly the culture that drives people to come to Kristu Jayanti. We aim at making KJ a university in the coming year. We have worked to fulfill all the parameters necessary to become a university.

What are your Jubilee plans?

As we celebrate 25 years of the institution, we have also identified 25 areas that we need to work on. We have to develop advanced knowledge skills and seek new insights

in the area of research. This will facilitate our faculty members to work more on development of research. We also have plans to adopt nearby village schools and colleges and help them with quality education.

You said you focus on students having a positive approach to life. With reports of increasing student related issues like suicide, drug abuse, financial problems and other distractions, how do you address such sensitive issues among students?

We have 12,000 students in KJ and fortunately we do not face any such problems to deal with. I attribute this to the kind of approach we have and the culture we imbibe in students. We do understand the energy levels in these young students and we make sure we channelize them in the best positive way. The students have tremendous opportunities to showcase their creativity, innovations, leadership roles and other talents to channelize their energy constructively. Parents need to help students

choose friends. Students need to be wise enough to distinguish between good and bad. We also have mentorship programmes that help students to deal with emotional, physical, societal, spiritual and religious issues. For students with troublesome family backgrounds seeking help we have counselors on campus along with a good team of psychologists from our department of Psychology.

Any significant challenges the institution has faced in its journey so far? More than challenges I must say we have used the opportunities to build this as an institution for higher education. We have the best faculty members and we invest primarily in teachers and their teaching practices. Research has been our prime area of focus. It is our academic framework and

competency and the pedagogical methods we follow that has made KJ occupy a place among the top five colleges in the state. Even during COVID we managed so well and developed our own Learning Management System (LMS) used in top universities. The challenge was training teachers but saw no such difficulties. Eventually online teaching practices became a norm and made it a part of our education system.

You will be getting the 'Deemed to be University' status soon, how challenging is it going to be and what kind of support is the institution looking out for?

The government is keen to see progress in the education sector. Bengaluru has become an education hub and seeing a huge inflow of students from across India

and the world over. The city has a conducive environment that provides multiple opportunities to students not only to study but also work and live here. More freedom must be given to private institutions to function effectively and flourish. This is the reason for more autonomous colleges seeking to become private universities. We have all the parameters like infrastructure, human resource, student strength, land, academic framework and so on to become a 'Deemed to be University' shortly. We have top placements with over 100 companies that absorb students from KJ. We have 600 members in the teaching faculty, 250 non-teaching staff and around 100 supporting staff on our campus. We provide a lot of scholarships to meritorious students, economically weak students and other achievers.
