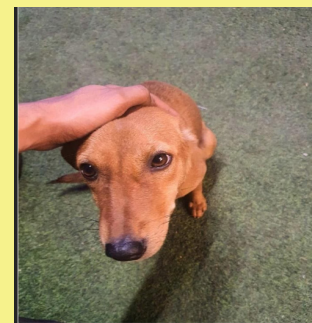
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Covid-19 An Assassin to The Local Vendors of Hormavu

BBMP has listed the lakes where work is being done as part of Mission 2022. According to the source, tenders for the rejuvenation of Horamavu and Gangashetty lakes have been set. Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike has played it safe and named lakes where construction is already underway for Bengaluru Mission 2022. BBMP has not listed any new lakes for rejuvenation and development under the mission, even as the city requires more water bodies. According to the list, 25 lakes have been chosen for which funds have been granted by the BBMP and by the CM's Nava Nagarothana scheme. Improvements to the lake bed, wetland etc are to be completed.

Through her eyes

Interview with Mahanaaz Tasneem a product manager at Brand Muscle who had been a victim of Covid -19

Since you were Covid positive can you explain its symptoms and effects?

I think personally health wise I did not see too much infection because I was almost asymptomatic so for me it was very basic. I wouldn't have gotten myself tested if I wasn't living with people who tested positive. For me it was just a week that I had body pain. It was a strange pain and you do

realize it is very different from what a normal viral fever body pain would be. So that's something I figured out about the virus because the pain just stands out. I would have shoulder pain for two weeks straight and it would be only 2 hours in the morning. So, I would sleep and wake up and wouldn't be able to move my left shoulder.

What treatment was administered to you?

I was asymptomatic to the most extent. It didn't make any sense to undergo any medication unless I really needed it, such as if my oxygen level dropped or if I had temperature. I was on medications such as multi vitamins for a

month as well as vitamin -C and vitamin-A. These were the three things that I took. I think it all depends on your specific case. It's completely driven by your symptoms and your state of being.

How did this affect your family?

Unfortunately for them on contrary to how it was for me it was pretty drastic for my parents and not for my brother. My parents were pretty seriously affected so they had to be hospitalized for a week. They were on the oxygen support even though their oxygen levels were not very low they were around 90 which is okay because they say below 90 is when you have to consider getting yourself

admitted. Their levels were 95 when they got admitted it's just that my dad was diabetic and my mom had to be admitted for safer side because we did get a CT scan and chest scan which clearly showed that the infection had spread quite a bit to the lungs which was not a good thing. The scan showed that it was pretty bad hence we got them hospitalised. I think for them it was more complicated.

Since you are a working woman how were you able to cope up with your work and health?

I think it is pretty difficult you don't realize until you are in it, because for me if I was living by myself, I don't think

that would have made so much of difference. Maybe 2 days I would have been okay. I was living with my parents they weren't doing so well. It was bit of a struggle luckily my company was understanding in that situation and I was allowed to take 10 days off. The infection can actually drain you out where you don't have energy what's so ever.

5.Finally, what is the biggest take away from this pandemic?

As cliché as it would sound, it just reminds you of how uncertain life is or life will be. You know you take everything for granted you take your freedom for granted.

Increase in sales of pottery in Bangalore

We can see the increase in the sale of pottery as Artisans have started generating a profit in pottery production after facing losses due to the pandemic. The craftsman used to earn around 500-600 rupees each day prior to the hit of the pandemic, but, recently they have been earning roughly 2,000 rupees per day. In Bengaluru, the craft of pottery production was on the edge of extinction. Out of 45 establishments in the famous pottery town, only 15 establishments has managed to survive. Three years ago, the business had dropped by 50-60% after the Bruhat Bengaluru Mahanagara Palike (BBMP) imposed a plastic ban in the city, people had begun to switch from plastic to clay-based products. However, After a lengthy period of loss owing to the Covid-19 Pandemic, artisans have begun to make a profit in pottery manufacture.

Renu, a pottery town consumer, noted that “purchasing clay products is not only cost-effective but also environmentally friendly. Aside from that, in this more computerised day, it is critical to protect our culture”.

The Karnataka State Handicrafts Development Corporation Ltd (KSHDC) was founded by the Karnataka government in 1964 to maintain and foster the state's art and culture while also improving the artisans' economic conditions.

Despite improving conditions in the pottery industry, families in the pottery town are not satisfied with the government because they are not allowed to demonstrate their skills. “To preserve the culture of pottery, the government should offer enough room for exhibitions in the city,” says Malti, a clay artist.

With the rise of the IT industry, Bengaluru, the state capital of Karnataka, has become one of Asia's fastest expanding cities.

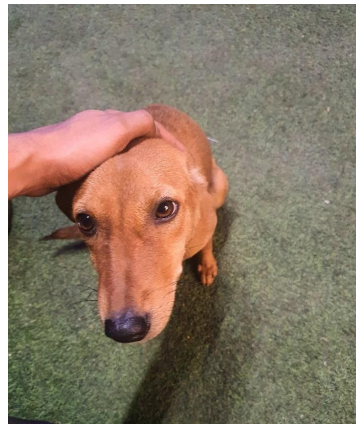
Plight of Stray Animals during the Pandemic Adopt and Support Stray Animals

Pooja Bahukhandi from Dehradun has fed over 180 stray animals. Celebrities like John Abraham took five steps that included naming the stray a person wanted to adopt, feeding the pet, arranging water, spending time with

the stray daily, and taking care of the medical needs of the stray. He also started an organisation that started the OOHA initiative. Bengaluru civic body releases Rs 15 lakh to feed stray animals and the initiative goes on in every part of the world.

Bangalore known for its big IT Parks is closed due to which many animals are suffering. Although many steps have been taken, the suffering of the animals is not decreasing. These initiatives taken by the governments and the people are easing the crisis but, more volunteers are required to make a considerable change in the situation.

smartphone supports a total of 12 bands. The business also stated that the smartphone will receive two-year OS upgrades. For decades, technological advancements have brought about significant changes in people's lives. The mobile data revolution has been the most significant in India during the last decade. This can be seen in the way India has risen from 155th place in mobile broadband penetration to become the world's largest mobile data consumer in only one year, surpassing both the United States and China combined. Future of co-working spaces in Bengaluru

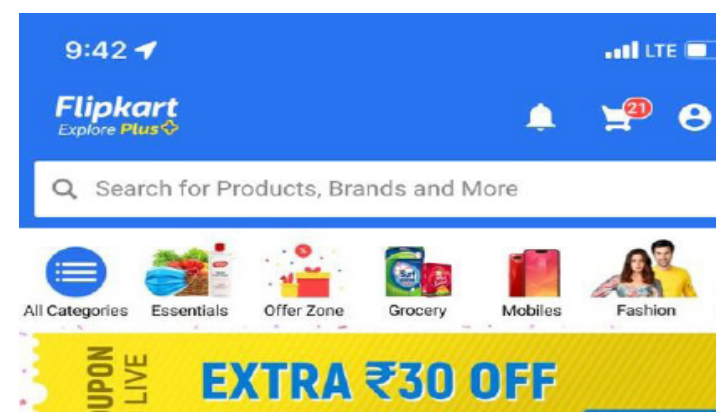
