



#### RTI AS A HUMAN RIGHT

ristu Jayanti College celebrated the international Human Rights Day on December 10, 2019, by organising the 39th edition of Vichaarmanthan. Prof. Madabhushi Sridhar Acharyulu, Former Central Information Commissioner, Government of India, interacted with postgraduate students on 'RTI as a Human Right'.

Prof. Acharyulu explained the characteristics of human rights and the role of the state in safeguarding the right to its citizens. He explained how information could empower citizens and build a transparent and accountable democracy.

Prof Madabhushi said, "Justice hurried is justice buried". He added that justice is something that can be served only if the third party, that is the court, is involved that is the court. As the court takes account of the proof, witness and makes a fair judgement rather than falling prey to emotions. He also emphasizes on the fact that the right to information is very important and every person should be aware of the rights they possess so that they are not exploited.

The second edition of Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam was organised under the aegis of the International Relations Office at Kristu Jayanti College aim to encourage more students to negotiate international platforms and thus enhance the Global Relations of Kristu Jayanti College and the prospects of its students.

His Excellency Oleg N. Avdeev, addressed the audience and elaborated on the many functions of the Russian Consulate in Chennai and its various aims, programmes and educational scholarships on offer. He stated that there is an increase of 30 per cent of Indian students who visit Russia for higher studies. he International Relations Office of Kristu Jayanti College organised a Global Relations Enhancement Programme on October 18, 2019. The programme titled 'Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam' -the world is one family- was conducted with the aim to encourage more students to interrelate with international platforms and thus to enrich global relations. His Excellency Mark Van de Vreken, the Consul General of Belgium was the chief guest of the day.

H. E. Mark Van De Vreken addressed the audience by explaining the functions of the Consulate in India and its various aims and accomplishments. He shared his experiences working in various Indian states and the journey of his diplomatic mission in India. Mr Vreken spoke about the interesting relations shared between India and Belgium during the course of 70 years of the cordial bilateral relations between the two countries. He

also talked about various foreign policies, the works of the United Nations, Multilateralism and Brexit. He stated, "It is important to be a part of the UN because it focuses on the maintenance of international peace and security." The programme helped the students to learn more about sustainable development and Sustanibale Development Goals Mr Vreken concluded his talk with a reflection on how hard work and determination can take one to success. "You can't always rest on your success, but must work continuously to pursue it", said Mr Vreken. The programme was concluded with a session in which he answered the queries raised by the students.

**Supply Chain** Management



he Department of Management (UG) of Kristu Jayanti College organised an International Guest Lecture on 'Supply Chain Management' on January 7, 2020. Dr Dinesh S Dave, Head, Department of Computer Information Systems & Supply Chain Management, John Walker College of Management, Appalachian State University, North Carolina, USA was the resource person.

Dr Dave explained the global importance of the supply chain today by citing examples of organisations such as Amazon, Target and Flipkart. He explained the working process of supply chain management and elaborated on how the flow of product, information and finance are important in the management. Dr Dave highlighted the importance of demand planning. Dr Dave suggested the improvements that can be made in the Indian infrastructure to enhance the effectiveness of the Indian supply chain. He also threw light on the current budget of India where the government has planned to spend Rs 102 lakh crore in infrastructure development.

#### International Business: Prospects and Challenges

Kristu Jayanti School of Management organised an International Lecture Series on September 24, 2019, for MBA students. Dr Martin Meznar, Associate Dean, Global and Civic Engagement, Walker College of Business, Appalachian State University, U.S.A was the keynote speaker. Dr Martin spoke on the topic 'International Business - Prospects and Challenges'.

In his address, Dr Meznar highlighted the greater need



for international trade for mutual growth, development and economic co-existence between nations. He reiterated the fact that trade must be a positive-sum game and not one that leads to trade wars and regional disturbances.

#### **Evidence-Based Social Work**

An International Lecture on 'Evidence-Based Social Work' was organised by the Department of Social Work of Kristu Jayanti College on November 22, 2019. Dr Esther Coren, Reader and Associate Director of Research, Canterbury Christ Church University, England was the keynote speaker.



Dr Esther Coren, highlighted the connection between research and practice. She shared the vital statistics of the increasing number of cases related to evidence-based practices. Dr Coren explained in detail the historical evolution of evidence-based practice, the issues and problems with social work and social care. Dr Coren explained this concept with relevant examples from the Indian context and winded up the lecture by stating the significance of specific focused research questions, evaluations of specific interventions and issues in evidence-based social work.



#### Criminal Psychology

he Department of Psychology of Kristu Jayanti College organised an International Guest Lecture on the topic 'Criminal Psychology' on February 15, 2020. The session was led by Dr Philip Laird from Trinity Western University, Canada who specialised in Psychology and Theology, self-deception (lying), technology and education, emotional intelligence, and moral reasoning.

Dr Laird, focused on topics like criminal and legal psychology by introducing the students to several key terminologies and their implications as seen from both the perspective of psychology and law. He began his lecture by describing three prominent criminal cases in Canada, during which the defendants had claimed they suffered from a mental disorder. He then went on to explain a few legal terminologies like 'Actus reus', 'Mens rea', 'Fitness to stand trial' and a few others. Dr Laird summed up this highly riveting session by asking the audience's verdict for each of the cases mentioned, in light of both the psychological as well as the legal notions that had been explained.

#### Artificial Intelligence and the Deep Learning Revolution

he session of the International Lecture Series was hosted on the topic 'Artificial Intelligence and the Deep Learning Revolution' on January 27, 2020, by the Department of Computer Science (PG). Mr Guy Brown, Head, Department of Computer Science, University of Sheffield, UK, was the resource person of the day.




The session emphasized the need for understanding the fundamentals and applications related to Deep Learning Revolution Technology and ways to achieve it. Mr Brown explained the 'Python Libraries' for performing text to speech and speech to text conversion. Image identification using 'TensorFlow' was also demonstrated by the resource person. There was also a demonstration of an application where the machine was capable of learning music from scratch.

They were also given information on how the data are collected, which are later put into a Diamond format for easier analysis. The students were told brief information on Computer-Aided Diagnosis (CAD) to help radiologists interpret medical images.





The first-year students taught communicative English and Value Education for children from class VIII to X. They also organised interactive games to make learning more interesting.





### WORKSHOP ON APPLIED ECONOMETRICS

The Department of Economics (PG), Kristu Jayanti College, has organised a National Level Workshop on Applied Econometrics on February 24 & 25, 2020. The resource persons were Dr Justin Michael Nelson and Dr Jyothi Manoj, Faculty, Kristu Jayanti College.

Econometrics, a concept by Adam Hayes, is the quantitative application of statistical and mathematical models using data to develop theories or testing the existing hypothesis in economics. The workshop provided an opportunity for the students to learn and to have an overview of the subject.

The topic 'Introduction to Econometrics Software- Gretl: Descriptive Statistics & Graphical Representations' was explained by Dr Justin Michael Nelson. It was followed by a session by Dr Jyoti Manoj, on various linear regression

models. Students learned about Multicollinearity, Autocorrelation and Heteroscedasticity, Jenkins models, autoregressive models and modelling volatility using heteroscedasticity, followed by ARCH & GARCH models during the two-day workshop.





# ACTION RESEARCH ON HEALTH LITERACY

The students of the Department of Social Work completed the data collection process for the Action Research on Health Literacy, promoting awareness on diabetics. This collaborative research was conducted by Baylor University, Texas, USA and Baptist Hospital, Bengaluru.

The students had completed the data collection process for the research titled on Use of a mHealth Application to improve Diabetes Health Literacy in India on March 4, 2020, the Mobile-Health Project, action-based research of Baylor University, the USA in collaboration with Bangalore Baptist Hospitals. Before data collection, the students were oriented by Dr Shelby Garner, Dr Hope Koch, Ms Julia Hitchcock, Associate Professors from Baylor University, Texas. The students spent a week-long time in the slums of Bangalore to test the mobile app to create awareness on diabetics and collected pre-post data. The research experience for the students culminated with an award of certificate and sharing of their experiences in the field.

# SPORTS PSYCHOLOGY SESSION

To motivate members of the various sports clubs, the Department of Physical Education conducted an expert session on Sports Psychology on February 6, 2020. Dr. Jonas Richard A, the Director of the Centre for Life Skills Education, the resource person for the event spoke on how psychology influences sports, athletic performance, exercise, and physical activity. He also suggested the ways of imagining peak performance and Dr Jonas also recommended certain practical tips to improve confidence, focus, composure, and trust in sports performance.

WORKSHOP ON PLAY THERAPY


### **WORKSHOP ON HUMAN RIGHTS**




### FOOTBALL **EXHIBITION MATCH**

# Centre for Employability and Corporate Relations (CECR)






### Career Support

## PROPERTY LAW IN INDIA-PROBLEMS AND PERSPECTIVES

Mr Subramanya highlighted various issues including the bias of news in the media. He pointed out 'media culture' and 'freedom of media' in India compared to the foreign nations. According to him, the media has to justify the main significance of media culture. He stressed about traditional, conventional and social media categories. He opined that once media played the role as the fifth pillar of democracy without any bias but, in the consequent years, it became the industry of money-making hub through which the owners of the media started spinning money by maximizing and optimizing their income of the press. He ended his address with a positive note that media will surely emerge as the most reliable platform of communication to the public with linking public policy and eradicating the factors of abuse to serve the cascading public truth with liberty and credibility. The lecture was followed by an interactive session with students as well as faculty members.

## **ORIENTATION ON** THE MODEL PARLIAMENT

Kristu Jayanti College of Law organised an 'Orientation on the Model Parliament' on August 31, 2019 and the resource person for the same was Sri N Harish, Advocate, High Court of Karnataka. The objective was to give an orientation on the Model Parliament

The orientation session aimed to train the students for the upcoming model parliament competition organized by the Young Men's Christian Association Bengaluru. Mr Harish started the session by talking about the importance of conducting such competitions and how helpful it will be for the students. He explained in detail the parliamentary procedures of the Presidential address in the joint sitting of the parliament, the motion of thanks, question hour, passing of the bills in the different stages etc. He also briefed about the decorum and behavioural mannerisms in the parliamentary halls. #### DEVELOPING MOOTING SKILLS

Kristu Jayanti College of Law organised a lectures series Kritrima Nyaya Vedika on March 4, 2020. The lecture titled 'Developing Mooting Skills' was taken by Mr Ashwin Kunal Singh and the students of Moot Court Society, Christ School of Law. The main objective of the lecture series was to prepare students for the moot court participation and developing mooting skills.

Ms Shilpa Rai, a fifth-year law student, explained the importance of mooting law students. She gave details on the nitty gritty of mooting and how to go about drafting of memorials or memorandums, proceedings of petitioners and respondents. Her session also covered the role Court Officers and how they liaison between the teams and the judges. She also stated that mooting is generally a specialised application of art of persuasive advocacy.

At the end of the session the students from the Christ School of Law demonstrated how a moot court competition happens. Both the respondents and the defendants emphasised on sticking to the issues presented in the memorial. Through this demonstration they explained the way a participant should address the judges and other mannerisms that have to be followed.



# CRIMINAL JURISPRUDENCE VIS-À-VIS CULPABLE HOMICIDE AND MURDER

Kristu Jayanti College of Law organised a webinar on May 23, 2020 and the resource person was Prof. Dr L Jayasri, Former Dean & HoD, Department of Law, Acharya Nagarjuna University. The topic for the lecture was 'Criminal Jurisprudence Vis-À-Vis Culpable Homicide and Murder'. A total of 394 participants attended this online interactive

Prof. Dr Jayasri explained the topic in great detail. Culpable Homicide and Murder are the two most brilliantly defined sections of the Indian Penal Code, 1860. Starting from the Trial Courts to the Supreme Court of India, various attempts have been made now and then to demarcate the difference between these two sections.

As readers of Criminal Law and also as citizens of this country who are governed by this Code we need to know the difference between the same. She also used important cases and illustrations to explain the difference between these two sections.

# CRIMINAL TRIAL AND PROCEDURAL FAIRNESS

Kristu Jayanti College of Law organised a lecture series, Nyaya Samvada on February 20, 2020 and the resource person for the lecture series was Smt. Rohini Salian, Former Special Public Prosecutor, National Investigation Agency. The topic for the lecture was 'Criminal Trial and Procedural Fairness' and it aimed to create awareness on Criminal Trial and Procedural Fairness

Ms Salian began her talk by asking us students to define the word "Law". As she engaged with the students she explained the importance of having basic knowledge about certain legal principles. She further emphasized the importance of having some knowledge about the Criminal Procedure because that is the basic law that would apply to any citizen when he or she is accused of committing any crime. She explained about the procedure that is followed by the police once an FIR is registered under Sec 154 of the Criminal Procedure Code. Towards the end of the session, students were allowed to engage with Ms Salian where they asked very relevant questions.




