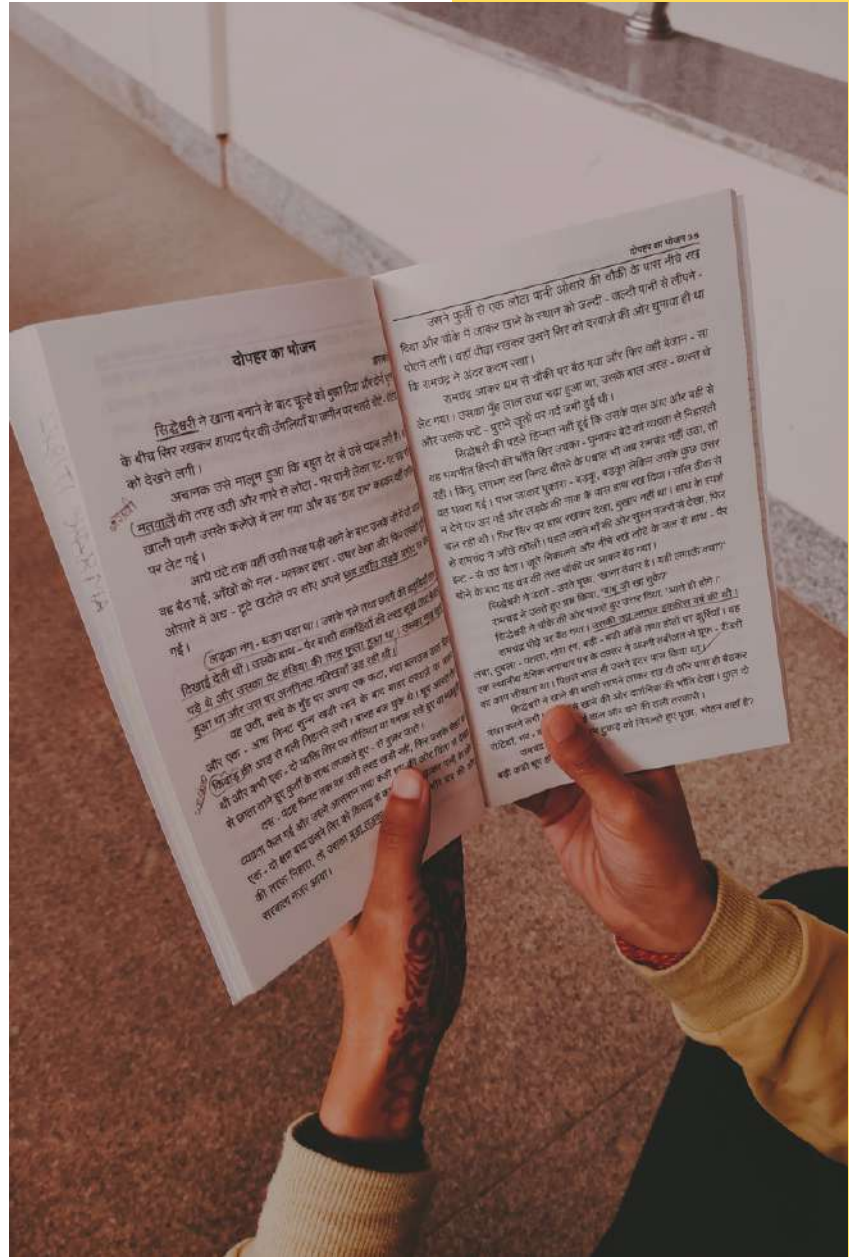
Decent Work and Economic Growth
