Tsundue's literary journey finds a pinnacle in his second

The esteemed guest of honor, Mr. Vinod Kumar from Accenture, inaugurated the event. Runing from 9:30 am to 4:30 pm, the exhibition showcased meticulously planned exhibits executed that garnered significant footfall.

The layout of the exhibits in the M1 auditorium was strategically designed to captivate the audience's attention. Enthusiastic students eagerly explained



their experiments, providing insights into the workings and relevance of each model.

Noteworthy exhibits included a gas leakage detector capable of alerting homeowners through a phone call, a detailed demonstration of the principle of centrifuge using a working model, inclined bells on a plane, "Protect Her" initiative, the mechanics of the solar system, and the calculation of Earth's weight. One particularly fascinating experiment involved a

centrifuge displaying movement of a wooden cork and a metal ball. As centrifuge operated, the cork ascended from the bottom to the top, while the ball descended from the top to the bottom - an engaging demonstration of centrifugal forces. The students' enthusiasm and willingness to impart knowledge made the exhibition not only informative but also educational.


