CONFERENCE CONCEPT NOTE

"I love not man the less, but Nature more"

Lord Byron

In the light of the recent climate changes and continual natural disasters, we feel obligated to revisit the literary discourses for a better understanding of 'nature.' What we understand of nature from literary texts coupled with stark historic evidence of repeated abuse and disregard for one's surroundings may necessitate an introspective study of how we have over the years conceived of agencies that are not human.

The omnipresence of non-human agencies at the backdrop of literary history and the recent critical interest it has generated in works like Silent Spring by Rachel Carson and The Open: Man and Animal by Giorgio Agamben speak volumes about how language helps us negotiate with our surroundings. Language plays a pivotal role in our understanding of 'nature' and determines the shape and significance we attribute to it.

The non-human agencies of land, animals, space etc. and our interaction with them are increasingly becoming the subject of discussions that interest environmental enthusiasts and literary scholars alike. In the face of large scale environmental catastrophes, species extinctions, and identity-altering advancements in science and technology, an anthropocentric worldview is neither sustainable nor defensible. Expanding the intellectual inquiry on 'nature' opens up a plethora of possibilities. This conference seeks to explore some of these possibilities vis-à-vis the non-human agencies in literary texts and human interaction with them. The conference further hopes to examine the present discussions on the topic and to explore their possible scope.
