Commander also presented an overview of the financial security of this profession to the cadets. "One of the guarantees of a career in the Armed Forces is a stable pension scheme. You can be assured that the pension scheme within the Armed Forces is secure and complete. You will not find any loopholes with regard to your salary either" He concluded his session by motivating the interested candidates to not to take a step back by assuming minimal payment and the limited post retirement offers.

The program came to a halt with a Question and Answer Session that allowed the cadets to presents many of their despite doubts connected to the recruitments of programs. Cadets and students who were inclined towards service in the Armed Forces were the main participants.
