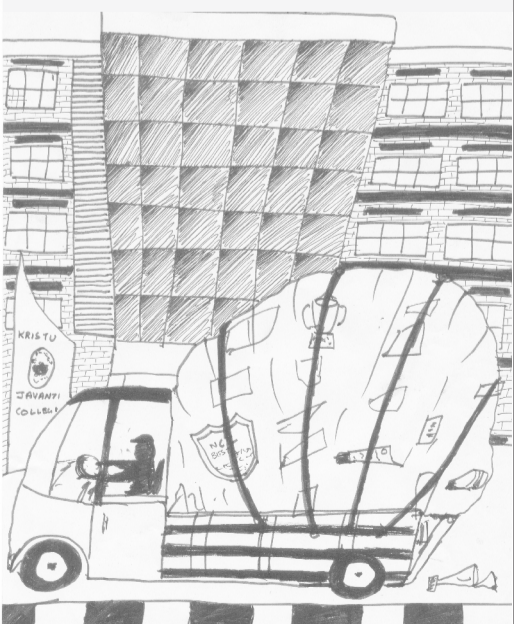
Kristu Jayanti College Conducted Blood Donation Camp

The inaugural function of the international conference was held on Feb 2, at 9:30. The event started with the invocation song by the college choir “symphony”. Prof Edward Aloysius, Conference Convenor, proposed the welcome address followed by a welcome message by the Rev Fr Josekutty P.D, Principal. He spoke on how we can manage change by mentioning the 4e's of effective leadership

Energy, Energize, Execution and Edge (competitive). Furthermore, he stressed on the point how the management/leaders of any organization must be always ready to face change or they will not be able to survive in the highly competitive and continuously changing corporate world.

Ms. Deepti Nayar introduced the chief guest of the day Mr. Marcel Hungerbuehler, C.E.O of Bangalore International Airport Limited, a 40 year

veteran of the aviation industry, spoke about Mr. Marcel remarkable milestones in his distinguished career having held various high level management positions at Swissair and Swissport, prior to joining BIAL. He was instrumental in the startup process and the operations of the New Bengaluru international airport which opened for operations in May 2007.

Mr. Marcel Hungerbuehler gave the keynote address and shared his experience and different approaches of reaction to change that he had encountered in career. He said “change is law of life, without change there is no life”. He also spoke how it is not the strongest who survive rather the ones who are most responsive to change. Dynamics of Indian Higher Education System & Challenges

Kristu Jayanti College recently organized a two-day national conference on 'Dynamics of Indian Higher Education System & Challenges', on September 30 & October 1. The Conference consisted of eight sessions. The inaugural address was given by Prof. N.R. Shetty, President, Indian Society for Technical Education, who started the session by highlighting the need for access of marginalized section to higher education along with various pro-active strategies for development. The session also encapsulated the crisis in higher education & emphasized the need for reforms in University education.

First day of the Conference consisted of four sessions headed by eminent speakers like Dr. K. Sudha Rao, National University of Educational Planning & Administration (NUEPA) who spoke about the policy initiatives in higher education with special emphasis on Yashpal Committee recommendations, followed by another session by Dr. Mariamma Varghese (former Vice chancellor, SNDT University, Mumbai) who spoke about quality gaps in Indian higher education system, by highlighting the SWOT analysis of higher education. The next keynote speaker for the session was Mr. A.M. Thimmiya, Senior Vice-President, Manipal University.

The main topic for discussion on Second day was on Higher Education in India-International perspective, which also consisted of four sessions chaired by Rev. Fr. Paul Vaz, Rector of St. Xavier's College, & chairman of St. Xavier's Institute of Management &

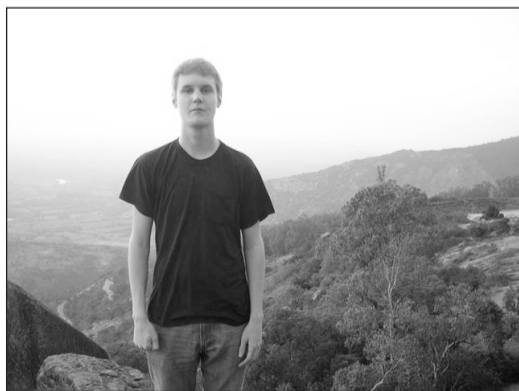
Research, Mumbai. The keynote speaker for fifth session was Rev. Dr. (Fr.) Thomas C. Mathew, Vice Chancellor, Christ University, Bangalore. The session focused on collaborative experiences of Higher education institutes which have worked towards higher academic reach & global visibility, the session also highlighted the various ways by which an institute can improve internationalization of Higher Education like Twinning program, Exchange of resources, Social action & Credit transfer. Sixth session was on Key issues & Challenges in Indian Higher Education System, chaired by Rev. Fr. Isaac P.J. The key note speaker of the session was Rev. Dr. Ignacimuthu S.J. Former VC, University of Madras & Bharathiyar University Coimbatore.

This was followed by a Panel Discussion on Policy Implementation & Systematic Plans. Shri. Ram Purohit- Head of Information Technology, Volvo & CII Education Panel Member, Ms. Seetalakshmi S- Editor, Times of India, Dr. M. Prakash-Principal, Seshadripuram First Grade College, Bangalore, were the panelists. The panel discussion highlighted the Changing Perspectives of Industry, media, academia about Higher education institutes

The main topic for the last session was Indian Higher Education- Future perspectives headed by another keynote speaker Dr. Sudhanshu Bhushan, Head of (NEUPA), the Chairperson was Prof. K. M. Narayana. The session dissected the meaning & difference of knowledge commission & Yashpal Committee recommendations in five key areas namely Governance, Quality, access & Equity, finance & Internationalization of higher education.
