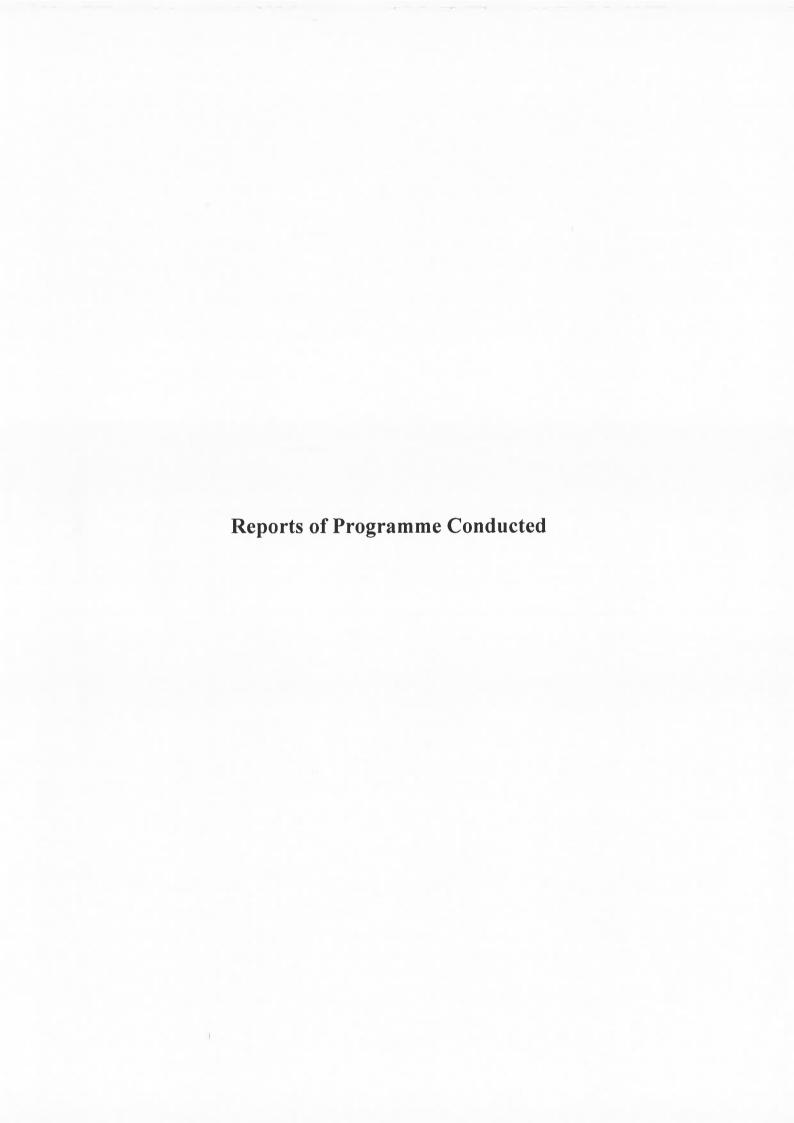


# **Entrepreneurship and Innovation Centre Major activities of EIC**

1. YESCAN: Young Entrepreneurs Series (YES) is an educative initiative aimed at installing entrepreneurship in the minds of the youth of Kristu Jayanti College. YES CAN is a program meant to create awareness about the entrepreneurial possibilities, the investment avenues and opportunities available for them. The event will showcase the best of Successful Young Indian Entrepreneurs who will share their experiences, challenges and methods to become successful entrepreneurs.

YES CAN 2017 is mainly focused on the theme of the year which is "Collaboration And Networking" (CAN) to attract more youths to the new world of opportunities towards starting enterprises and embracing entrepreneurship. The main highlights of YES CAN 2017 include:

- > Focus on encouraging and attracting more than 200 interested students.

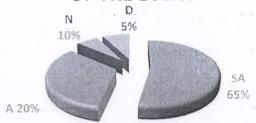
The students were really inspired by Mr. Sandeep's interaction, in which they had to come up with their own start up ideas and present it in front of everyone.

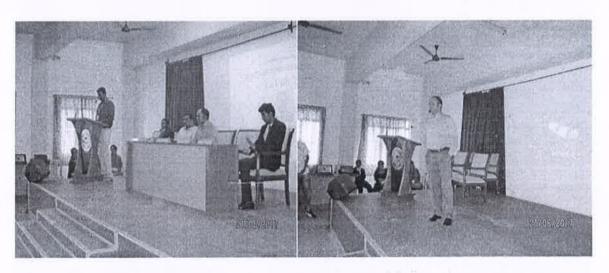

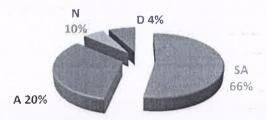
The students were really inspired by Ms.Jeyalakshmi, in which they had to come up with their own start up ideas and present them before the entire participants.
