

Brief write up on the programme:

World Biofuel Day is observed on August 10 and the day is set aside to raise awareness about unconventional fuel sources that can serve as an alternative to the more traditional fossil fuels. The emphasis is on the usage of non-fossil fuels or biofuels that enable cleaner consumption patterns.


Brief Write up on the Programme:

On the occasion of Zero Emissions Day, Centre for Environment and Sustainability and Centre for Social Activities of Kristu Jayanti College, Autonomous initiated a drive to monitor the alarming carbon emission rate in the atmosphere on 21 September2021. As Carbon emission plays a defining role in climate change, it is the responsibility of the younger generation to protect our environment from harmful emissions. As a modest gesture, all vehicles of the students and staff of Kristu Jayanti College were checked to assess the carbon emission level, thus contributing to the green campus to curb the emission rate. The drive was inaugurated by Rev. Fr. Emmanuel P J, Director, Kristu Jayanti College of Law. The emission test took place in the College premises with the issue of Pollution Under Control (PUC) by an authorised agency on 24th September and Pollution Certificates were issued. A total of 205 vehicles were checked for emission in a single day and Pollution Under Control (PUC) certificates were issued. The drive conveyed awareness about the consequences of carbon emissions and called for collective action to renew the polluted planet. Students actively participated in understanding the significance and seriousness of conserving and building a sustainable green world. The event further encouraged faculties and students to cultivate atmosphere-friendly choices to preserve our planet for a greener future.



REPORT ON INTERNATIONAL E-WASTE DAY

Title: E-Rase your E-waste

Date: October 07, 2021 to October 13, 2021

Objective:

- To provide proper handling and management of toxic e-waste chemical substances.
- To create awareness about e-waste management
- To protect the environment and living organisms from e-waste issues.

Brief report:

October 14 is considered International E-waste Day. E-waste denotes any electrical or electronic equipment that has been discarded. This comprises working and damaged items that are thrown in the garbage. E-waste is mainly dangerous due to toxic chemicals that naturally leach out from the inside part of the metals when buried. Such wastes include Home Appliances, Communications and Information Technology Devices, Home Entertainment Devices, Electronic Utilities, Office and Medical Equipments. Every year millions of tons of electronic waste are discarded, and we need to improve the way it is disposed of and the necessary steps to prevent it from becoming a major environmental issue. The day is observed to raise awareness on e-waste recycling.

The Centre for Environment and Sustainability and Department of Computer Science (UG), Kristu Jayanti College (Autonomous) attempted to raise awareness on e-waste management by collecting e-waste for recycling. Students, Faculties, and Administrative staff have deposited the e-waste in the bins which are placed in various blocks. We collected various e-waste equipment such as a mouse, keyboard, wire, Circuit boards, DVDs, Compact disks, Audio Equipment, amplifiers, and so on. The e-waste is recycled in collaboration with e-vendor, Sonal Metacorp.





AICTE and NITTTR have jointly embarked on a novel initiative of preparing training modules and building capacities of Senior Teachers of Engineering Colleges and Universities, who are in the decision making managerial level of their institutions, on the Environment Improvement and Sustainability of campuses. These modules are titled "Clean, Green and Sustainable Technology". It is part of the Ministry of Education's SWAYAM online platform for learning for the Faculty of Higher Education. Kristu Jayanti College has been referred to NITTTR by Ms.Bineesha, Executive Director of IIWM, and Mr.Pravinjith, MD, Ecoparadigm who are also the Expert Advising the Ministry of Education in Green Campus Development.







ECOLOGICAL ROLE OF BUTTERFLIES

Date: On 20th November 2021 at 12:00 P.M

No. of Beneficiaries: 383 Degree Students

Resource Person: Mr. Haneesh K M, founding member Bangalore Butterfly Club and Associate Professor at Christ University.

A webinar was organised by the Centre of Environment and Sustainability of Kristu Jayanti College in association with the Bangalore Butterfly Club on 20th November 2021 at 12:00 pm. The topic of the webinar was "Ecological role of Butterflies"

The session was started with a silent prayer. Ms. Pruthvitha Pratap, student coordinator welcomed the resource person, Mr. Haneesh K M and all the delegates in the online platform.

The resource person, Mr. Haneesh started his talk by sharing his presentation slides depicting the beauty and morphology of butterflies. He explained about different types of butterflies, their taxonomy, and their characteristics. Each class of butterfly was explained in detail by him, from the morphology, the early stages and the process of "metamorphosis". Detailed eye-catchy images and visual representations were provided which made the session interesting.

The pupa stages and the adult stages of butterfly development were shown in different classes of the butterflies. He then continued talking about how butterflies might get infected by bacteria or fungi and how infections can be prevented.

Then the ecological and commercial importance of butterflies and how they play an important role in the food chain and food web. Also explained on the way butterflies can be protected by increasing numbers of host and nectar plants.

He educated the participants about how one can develop butterfly gardens in the campus. He stressed the importance of butterfly garden and the steps involved in developing the butterfly garden which includes:

- 1. Requirement of proper land
- 2. Preparation of land to grow a butterfly garden
- 3. Selection of plants- host and nectar plants and not using invasive plants
- 4. Introduction of plants
- 5. Maintenance in a sustainable way (using natural methods to take care)

Visuals of small to big butterfly gardens and closed area parks which are found in Bangalore Bannerghatta Biological Park were shown as an example to understand how butterfly gardens are developed.

He concluded by giving examples of different host and nectar plants and mentioning the importance of butterflies to the ecosystem.

A vote of thanks was given by Ms. Devi Vaishnavi, the student coordinator. This was followed by a photo session and the college anthem. Dr. Priya Josson, head of Centre for Environment and Sustainability and the coordinator for the event, Dr. Sheeja Krishnakumar thanked the resource person for his elaborate explanation on the ecological role of butterflies.

In the webinar, more than 300 participants were present which included students and faculty from all the departments.






Brief write up on the programme:






humans, the biodiversity is depleting. It is therefore imperative to adopt sustainable methods to preserve and replenish the nature.


Outcome:




Brief Write-up on the Programme:



Brief write-up

The much-awaited terrace gardening initiative was started off by the members of the CES on 14 November 2022. The students along with the faculty in charge gathered at the nursery area at 1:30 pm. A brief description of the process was given by Dr. Sivagamasundari with the assistance of Mr. Binu. The students prepared the pot mix and filled the grow bags with dried leaves and manure accordingly. The first later was with dried leaves. The potting mix was mixed by the students in a seperate tray and then transferred to the grow bags. The pot mix was a mixture of soil, cow dung and coco peat which was mixed manually by the students. The growbags were ready within an hour due to the combined effort of each member. The grow bags were kept aside and transferred to balcony/ terrace of the third floor of PG block.

Outcome:

The activity motivated students be one with nature, the art of preparing the right pot mix by incorporating earthworms, vermicompost and cocopeat and to set the grow bag for growing vegetables.



- To produce biological and ecofriendly materials from coconut wastes.

Brief Write up on the Programme:

The Centre for environment and sustainability accomplished an activity on the production of cocopeat, an organic, sustainable and eco-friendly approach to replenish and conserve soil. Cocopeat is an environment friendly medium for root growth, aeration of soil, retention of soil moisture and also as component of organic manure. 


Brief Write up on the Programme:


