Brief Report about the Programme:

The School of Management of Kristu Jayanti College (Autonomous) celebrated Teacher's Day on 05th September 2021 by organizing a unique Social Outreach Programme – 'Seva Sourabha' by interacting and organizing sports and entertainment programmes for Migrant workers living around the vicinity of Kristu Jayanti College, K Narayanapura, Bengaluru.

The Teachers from the School along with the first year MBA students visited camps of migrants. The whole batch is divided into four teams and visited the

camp sites of the migrant workers to know more about their livelihood and living circumstances. A survey titled 'Impact of Literacy on Livelihood of floating migrant construction workers in Bangalore North' was conducted during the visit. The four sites visited are the 1. Migrant camp next to Kristu Jayanti College, 2. Migrant camp behind the Public Health Centre, K, Narayanapura, 3. Migrant camp in Naganahalli Main Road, and 4. Migrant camp in BDS Nagar

The interaction help to collect details like reasons for migration, family status, employment, governmental support, civic amenities availed, children's education, impact of pandemic, vaccination status, health and hygiene. The teams conducted various programs in all the four venues, include sports and entertainment. There were special programs for the children of migrant workers. The winners were given gifts.

Learning Outcome: Various causes for migrating, their employment and family situation, their children's education, the benefits and drawbacks of working as a migrant worker, and so on.

Brief Write up on the Visit:

DAY 1: "SEVA MANOBHAVA"

An Initiative for social Awareness and Welfare

The Social Outreach Programme for the Day 1 was organized at Nagenahalli, Narayanpura. The location is a rural camp where migrant workers and their families live together. Their children are enrolled in the school which is located at the same location. The M.Com and M.Com FA students organized teaching programs and games for the kids. The students taught the kids about alphabets, numbers and numerical operations. The practice sheets were provided to the kids and tested their numerical competence.

As the day progressed, the kids were encouraged to play games. Another set of students were responsible for performing a campaign on dengue awareness and Covid-19 safety awareness. The students also conducted a survey about the workers' daily wages and their financial competence.

Finally the M.Com and M.Com FA students helped by proving stationery kits which included books, pencils and sheets. The kids and their families were delighted with the programs that were conducted and the students were informed about the living conditions in the rural areas.





Students organized awareness programs like COVID awareness, Dengue awareness, Financial awareness, Basic banking awareness and also took surveys of the people residing nearby.







The programme was concluded with the Jayantian Anthem.







Brief Report about the Programme:

Overview:




Brief Write up on the Programme:

Two Day Campaign in Commemoration of UN Day

Date: 22/10/2021 and 23/10/2021

In commemoration of the United Nations Day, the Department of Media Studies (PG) of Kristu Jayanti College (Autonomous), Bengaluru, organised a two-day campaign, "Make a Difference: Be the Difference", as part of rural exposure. The campaign was conducted in Kannamangala, Purushanahalli, and Kanaswadi Governments schools with a focus on student empowerment and rural analysis. To reduce the inequalities and to measure the digital divide in the village, numerous programs were conducted by the students.

A survey was conducted to analyse the impact of Covid-19 in the village and their difficulties to encounter the pandemics. The exposure of the rural population to media platforms in a digital age for information and awareness was also analysed as part of the survey. One hundred fifty school children in the villages were empowered by conducting different curricular and extracurricular activities. The effectiveness of the vaccination drive in the villages was also measured to understand the efficiency of vaccination campaigns.

A green awareness drive at the village households was also a part of the campaign. Five hundred saplings were planted in the village in the campaign days, and 55 saplings were distributed to the children in schools to nurture for the future. Two thousand masks, sanitisers, and Covid awareness leaflets were also dispersed in the village to ensure safety during pandemics.

The campaign was conducted in partnership with Gujarat Tourism and WFV (Water for Voiceless). The media students were able to initiate development programs in the village successfully. A variety of programs, including cultural and experimental design, were organised for children to engage with the mainstream. Dr Juby Thomas, Faculty of Media Studies (PG), and Prof. Retheesh Palakkuzhyil, from the Department of Tourism, coordinated the two-day campaign.

Brief Report about the Programme:

A Rural Exposure Programme 'Gramasamveditha' was organized by the School of Management, Kristu Jayanti College (Autonomous) on the 12th November 2021 at three villages of Kannamangala, Kannasawadi, and Purushanahalli of Nelamangala Taluk, Bangalore Rural District. Social Work Camp (2021 – 2023 Batch)

The Department of Social Work, Kristu Jayanti College, Bangalore organised the Social Work Camp for the first-year students in close collaboration with the Ashalaya Trust Vidya Nagar, Central Telecom Society, Bengaluru, Karnataka. The camp commenced from the 23rd of May 2022 and ended on the 29th of May 2022; it was held in the village of Hutthanahalli. The village is situated 11km away from sub-district headquarter Bangalore North (tehsildar office) and 11km away from district headquarter Bangalore. The major languages spoken in this area are Kannada, Tamil, Hindi. The village was not entirely under developed or a completely remote area it had access to services within and around the village.

The major intention of the camp was to have the potential social workers be familiar with the rural social system, apart from this the other major aim was to provide the experience of group living to these emerging social workers. In the process of this camp the social work trainees are given several opportunities to develop and to also refine skills like organising and managing, planning, team spirit, evaluation and appreciation and several others. Essentially it aimed at ensuring and providing the trainees a platform to develop themselves as potential social workers and more importantly as human beings.

Planning for the camp-initiated weeks before the actual days of the camp. To ensure smooth functioning two student coordinators namely Mr Aquil C Sunny and Ms Shilpa Thomas were appointed. To furthermore divide and simplify tasks, committees were created for the camp and for each of the 9 committees that were created, a leader was appointed. The committees and the respective leaders included

Transport Committee (Mr Darren Flemming), Food Committee (Ms Stephy Mathew), Program Committee (Ms Anusha Mary James), Cultural Committee (Ms Goldy Ann Jacob), Documentation Committee (Ms Rosanne Ditosa Fernandes), Finance Committee (Mr Vibin Peter), First Aid Committee (Ms Sampita Malakar), Purchase Committee (Mr Karthick Kumar), Cleaning Committee (Ms Anita James). In addition to this there were various themes to be highlighted on each day of the camp, to mention a few of these themes they included Women Empowerment, Child Rights and Sports Day, Youth Empowerment/Development and so on.

The day began with the arrival of the trainees and faculty members to the college in the morning at 9.30 am, following which all the necessary instruction and arrangement were made in relation to the camp. However, it was only after receiving the blessings and approval of the principal, Rev Fr Dr Augustine George, did the social work campers along with the faculty leave the campus together for the campsite in the village at Huttanahalli.

Upon reaching the campsite, some time was spent to settle and this was followed by the campers moving around the village in order to introducing themselves and build a rapport with the villagers.

Later an inaugural ceremony was planned in the nearby temple which was the common place to gather for the villagers. Some of the dignitaries for the ceremony included, the sarpanch **Dodda Baswaraj**, the other panch members, **Sr Bhindu** from the Ashalaya Trust and the Head of the department. The ceremony began with one of the young local girls being invited to sing a pray song to invoke the blessing of God, next a welcome address was delivered by Ms Jesme Joy (social work trainee) following which the dignitaries were felicitated with a shawl and **Dr Jonas Richard A** addressed the

gathering on how important the camp is in building and exploring ourselves and those around us. The theme for the day was **Base Line Survey** in the community, in order to better understand the community and the conditions of living in the village.

The survey that was prepared by the programme committee was circulated and pairs were formed; these were temporary and were bound to change every day. After this everyone was taught on how to pronounce certain words and other important basic sentences in Kannada were also shared as most were not fluent in the language.

Following the end of the survey an analysis was done which showed that a majority of the men make any and all decisions of the family. Only a small number of families have both the man and women together making decisions.

Towards the evening half of the day, an intercultural programme was held with an action dance, songs, and a short film screening was also done in order to sensitize the village members on issues like prevention of spread of covid 19 and so on. There were a total of almost more than 80 participants, who all together made a very enthusiastic crowd.

Towards the end of the day, a short while was spent for evaluation to understand the campers progress and areas that needed improvement, all of this was discussed during this time. One of the major agreed upon areas that needed work was not planning but mostly the execution of what was being planned. This led to a formal end of the second day.

The day began with a survey being carried out by pairs once again on the theme Women Empowerment and health and hygiene amongst women. Upon distributing themselves in order to cover the village area, the data was collected and was later analysed by a group of social work campers. One of the major findings was that a majority of the women failed to give importance to self-care and put family needs above their own.

During the afternoon half of the day, the Head of the department paid a visit to the campsite, majorly since there was a probability of the principal of the college dropping by the campsite and also to get an update of the happenings in the camp. Hence there were a few campers who worked on the programme for the arrival of the principal to the campsite and the rest worked on the cultural programme for the evening.

However, by noon it was informed that the principal would be unable to visit due to some reasons. The campers hence began to divert all their energy towards the evening programme which involved a role play, regional dance and song and also a screening of a short film. Following the end of the programme, the campers came back to the campsite and had their dinner. After which all the campers began to work on completing the general report for the social work camp, thus the day came to an end.

The theme for the day was Youth Conditions/ Involvement and Alcohol Consumption in the village.

Once more the day began with a survey being carried out by pairs again on a different theme which was Youth conditions/involvement and alcohol consumption in the village. Upon distributing themselves in order to cover the village area, the data was collected and was later analysed by a group of social work campers. The analysis showed that the consumption of alcohol was indeed present at a high level.

The campers worked on preparing for the cultural programme for the evening. One major setback during the cultural programme was the power cut which led to the failure in screening the short film. However regional dance and songs were played to sensitize the crowd. There was also a role play enacted to highlight the drawbacks of alcohol consumption.

The day came to an end, after the evaluation which had to be ended early due to the unexpected arrival of the rain, thus marking the end of day 4.

During the latter half of the day the campers were required to complete their reports for the previous few days which was a requirement for the camp.
