

Objective: To commemorate World Environment day

To commemorate the World Environment day 2021, a virtual webinar on 'Green Technologies for Recovery of Bioenergy From Municipal and Industrial Solid Wastes' was organized jointly by the Department of Life Sciences and the Environment club of Kristu Jayanti College on 05. 06. 2021. Every year on 5th of June, the world celebrates World Environment Day, in order to inculcate a sense of belongingness and gratitude towards the environment that we live in. This in turn would inspire more individuals to stand with the cause of environment conservation and contribute to restore the environment. The World Environment Day through the myriad forms of campaigns organized world over in its observance offers an effective platform for inspiring positive change in the environment. It pushes individuals to think about the ways we utilize the ecosystem and gives us a chance to take action to build a greener future. This year's theme for World Environment Day was 'Ecosystem Restoration'. Ecosystem restoration means preventing, halting, and reversing the damage caused by human activities and finally healing our nature. The webinar hosted by the Department of Life Sciences in association with the environment club featured a topic that is very relevant to the concept of ecosystem restoration. Municipal and Industrial solid wastes contributes heavily to deterioration of various ecosystems by contaminating the natural environment. For instance, a major threat to many aquatic ecosystems is the indiscriminate practice of dumbing untreated household and industrial waste in water bodies. Environment friendly, restorative and scalable solutions to the problem of waste management are of vital importance for ecosystem restoration and sustenance. Dr. S V Srinivasan, Senior Principal Scientist, Department of Environmental Engineering, CSIR-Central Leather Research Institute (CLRI), was the resource person for the webinar. Through his highly intelligible talk, he introduced biotechnology-enabled green approaches in solving the problem of accumulating municipal and industrial solid waste. While comparing the various approaches he brought out the pros and cons of each. Interesting ways of converting waste into biofuels using green approaches were also discussed.




Objective: A celebration International Youth day to raise awareness about the cultural and legal issues surrounding the youth

Two-Day Campaign in Commemoration of UN Day

Venue: Kannamangala, Purushanahalli, and Kanaswadi

In commemoration of the United Nations Day, the Department of Media Studies (PG) of Kristu Jayanti College (Autonomous), Bengaluru, organised a two-day campaign, "Make a Difference: Be the Difference", as part of rural exposure. The campaign was conducted in Kannamangala, Purushanahalli, and Kanaswadi Governments schools with a focus on student empowerment and rural analysis. To reduce the inequalities and to measure the digital divide in the village, numerous programs were conducted by the students.

A survey was conducted to analyse the impact of Covid-19 in the village and their difficulties to encounter the pandemics. The exposure of the rural population to media platforms in a digital age for information and awareness was also analysed as part of the survey. One hundred fifty school children in the villages were empowered by conducting different curricular and extracurricular activities. The effectiveness of the vaccination drive in the villages was also measured to understand the efficiency of vaccination campaigns.

A green awareness drive at the village households was also a part of the campaign. Five hundred saplings were planted in the village in the campaign days, and 55 saplings were distributed to the children in schools to nurture for the future. Two thousand masks, sanitisers, and Covid awareness leaflets were also dispersed in the village to ensure safety during pandemics.

The campaign was conducted in partnership with Gujarat Tourism and WFV (Water for Voiceless). The media students were able to initiate development programs in the village successfully. A variety of programs, including cultural and experimental design, were organised for children to engage with the mainstream. Dr Juby Thomas, Faculty of Media Studies (PG), and Prof. Retheesh Palakkuzhyil, from the Department of Tourism, coordinated the two-day campaign.

Women and Poverty (Economic Violence) in connection with The International Day for Elimination of Violence against Women

25 November, 2021 was declared as a day of significance by the UN who marked the day as The International Day for Elimination of Violence against Women. To increase the awareness about this day Kristu Jayanti College which is the - United Nations Academic Impact Hub for SDG 1 conducted a Webinar on Women and Poverty (Economic Violence). Dr Jonas Richard, Coordinator UN SDG HUB -1 set the stage for the webinar with his prelude mentioning that Nearly 1 in 3 women have been abused in their lifetime. In times of crises, the numbers rise, as seen during the COVID-19 pandemic and recent humanitarian crises, conflicts and climate disasters. While pervasive, gender-based violence is not inevitable. It can and must be prevented. Stopping this violence starts with adopting comprehensive and inclusive approaches that tackle the root causes, transform harmful social norms, and empower women and girls.

The speaker for the day was Mrs Sagaya Shanthy, Head, Women's Unit, Indian Social Institute, Bangalore and an eminent social activist. She highlighted the fact that 1975-85 was declared as the International Decade for Women by the UN. But more than 700 million or 10% of world's population still struggle under the crippling weight of poverty where their basic needs are not fulfilled. Poverty increases violence. Mrs Shanthy spoke at length on Women and Poverty and added that females being the most side-lined in the social constructs, were more prone to exploitation including trafficking. During the times of pandemic, the statistics for violence against women in the home environment doubled. In many parts of the world women are still denied basic socio-political and economic rights. Unconstrained physical mobility and physical security is a matter of concern with respect to many women around the globe. Many women struggle against a sense of unconscious discrimination which is prevalent and inbuilt in the culture and society they belong to. Mrs Shanthy spoke passionately to the listening youth about bringing about a change in these existing stereotypes, and how adopting the SDGs would play a part in challenging these outdated beliefs. She concluded with the thought that Equality and prioritising the strategic needs of the female gender can be a viable solution and a positive way forward.





SDG ACTION RESEARCH PROJECTS,

KRISTU JAYANTI COLLEGE, UNAI HUB FOR SDG 1

Kristu Jayanti College Autonomous, a UNAI Hub for SDG 1 in continuation of our mission to eradicate poverty carried out 7 Participatory Action Research Projects in the year 2022. The research projects were documented and published as a book edited by Dr Jonas Richard, titled **SDG ACTION RESEARCH: EVIDENCES FROM THE FIELD** by Infinite Learning Solutions, Bangalore.

PROJECT 1: ACTION RESEARCH ON MINIMIZING OPEN DEFECATION PRACTICE AMONG MIGRANTS

The students of Kristu Jayanti College from the Department of Social Work conducted an SDG Action Research Project to stop the practice of open defecation among the migrant populations in Kothanur. The team identified a 17-family migrant settlement in a slum in Kothanur. The students compiled the socio-demographic background data of the migrants through a baseline survey that covered their work profile, food habits, hygienic practices, awareness of COVID-19 and their vaccination status. The survey helped identify the fact that the slum residents' urgently needed restrooms. This would further help combat them falling prey to the 3rd wave of the pandemic by good hygienic practices. The students with the help of the faculty members of the Social Work Department targeted this need by conducting several fundraising drives. They raised enough money to finance 2 mobile toilets for the community. The mobile toilets were installed much to the joy of the women in the slum who were the worst affected because of the lack of restrooms. The women members of the community expressed their thankfulness to the researchers for meeting this basic need of a restroom facility. Following the installation, the researchers returned to the community once a week to check in on the maintenance of the facilities. The researchers were glad to note that there was a positive behavioural change among the community members. The toilets helped them adopt better practices in sanitation and had a positive impact on their health practices caused by a drastic change in their prior behaviour of open defecation. The researchers further conducted an awareness workshop to educate the community members of the importance of personal hygiene and its importance in the face of the third wave of the pandemic. The Department of Social work at Kristu Jayanti College remains committed to the welfare of the community, and the SDG Action Research on reducing open defecation by the migrant community was successful because of their guidance and the efforts of the student team members who belonged to Project 1 of the SDG Action



PROJECT 2: SDG ACTION RESEARCH ON THE PSYCHOSOCIAL ENHANCEMENT OF CHILDREN IN FOSTER CARE

A team of students of Kristu Jayanti College conducted an Action Research on The Psycho-social Enhancement of Children in Foster Care Homes. The research gathered valuable data on the sociodemographic profile of foster children in Bengaluru to increase their awareness of the importance of good emotional health and psycho-social skills. A Needs Assessment was conducted by the Social Work students to learn about the condition of the foster children. A foster home in Bangalore was identified as the pilot subject of the study. The researchers in an effort to gain an in-depth knowledge of the circumstances and psycho-social problems of the foster children and the effects of the Covid-19 outbreak on the resources available in these families, conducted focus group discussions with the children. The subject of "how to behave in front of people, either in a formal or informal setting and learning to manage their emotions were the main topics of the conversation. Since some of the young girls were going through a time in their lives where psychological shifts were cropping up it was determined that a workshop focusing on this topic would be a great help. In the workshop groups of 7-8 children participated in group sessions and interactions with the researchers. Six such sessions were held with the goal of fostering relationships and developing good emotional health. Peer-to-peer feedback was also incorporated for the benefit of the workshop participants. Apart from the psycho-social interventions the Department of Social Work the researchers were also involved in resource mobilisation that were customized to the requirements of the particular foster family. At the end of SDG Project 2 an intensive and interactive feedback session by the researchers revealed positive changes in the children's behaviour. They were thus able to draw the conclusion that their intervention in the community was immensely constructive with long lasting benefits.

PROJECT 3: ACTION RESEARCH ON ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT OF A TRANSGENDER COMMUNITY

A team of researchers from Kristu Jayanti College conducted a research with the aim of providing economic empowerment to a specific transgender community. It was decided that financial sustainability was the primary need to enable them to live with self-esteem and independence. Hence the researchers began to raise money through a variety of fundraising drives. The researchers successfully raised Rs 36,000 and purchased 5 brand-new sewing machines. This was followed up with training sessions that were conducted to enhance their skills and also understand the importance of good financial skills. The training focused on leadership skills, financial literacy and digital marketing. The researchers arranged for training sessions on how to use sewing machines and thus upgrade their entrepreneurial skills. They were also provided with seed money to launch their tailoring businesses. The students of Kristu Jayanti College endeavored to help the transgenders gain their self-esteem and dignity by maintaining and regaining control over their finances and other resources.

PROJECT 4: ACTION RESEARCH ON LIVELIHOOD PROMOTION OF THE WOMEN OF THE WASTE PICKERS COMMUNITY

This Action Research project aimed to address the needs of the women of the waste pickers community in the neighbourhood of the College. A survey was conducted to understand their living conditions, socio-demographic profile and identify the challenges and needs of the women in the Waste pickers community.

The students of the Department of Social work identified GRACE a non-governmental organization located at Horamavu, Bangalore to conduct their Action Research. Their main strategy was conducting concentrated group conversations to understand the real plight of the target goup. The students of Kristu Jayanti College interacted with many trash collectors at different spots to gain an understanding of their work and personal lives. The students also travelled with them to gain a better understanding of their work, family situations and living arrangements. Focused group discussions were conducted to identify the perceptions of women in adapting to this particular livelihood, the economic burden on families, psychological problems of women, and their hope to building a different lifestyle for the upcoming generation. The students created a fund-raising flyer which they distributed, receiving positive and negative reactions and financial contributions from the Public. The researchers were able to raise Rs. 23,000 with which two sewing machines, several reels of thread, tailoring scissors, measurement tape, tailoring chalks and a collection of reusable fabric for practise fitting were purchased. The women of the

waste pickers' community were able to benefit from the supplies given by the students and were able to hone and refine their tailoring skills.

The students of the Department of Social Work at Kristu Jayanti College were able to witness firsthand the value of education for the next generation and how it might affect the lives of the children in their effort to break the cycle of poverty.

PROJECT 5: SDG ACTION RESEARCH ON THE HEALTH AND HYGIENE PRACTICES OF A MIGRANT COMMUNITY

A few of the students of the Department of Social work took the initiative to hold a COVID -19 Awareness Program and distribute COVID -19 prevention kits to the residents of the BDS Nagar Slum especially to the men and women who were employed in Kothanur in the neighborhood of Kristu Jayanti College. In collaboration with the Department of Social Work at Kristu Jayanti College in Autonomous Bangalore, the awareness event was held for around 80 residents of the slum, including men, women, and children. The students through their interaction with the community members learned about the community's struggles caused by lack of restrooms, especially the hardships faced by the elderly, expectant mothers and young girls who found open defecation embarrassing and distressing. The students soon managed to install a mobile toilet for the community. The students also conducted sessions and awareness on proper menstrual hygiene for the women of the community. The students of Kristu Jayanti College also completed a post-analysis survey and were delighted to notice the improvements in the community's sanitary conditions. The community members were really pleased with the social work trainee's involvement and support and expressed the same to the researchers.

PROJECT 6: ACTION RESEARCH ON ENSURING CHILD SAFETY AND NUTRITIONAL NEEDS OF THE CHILDREN OF MIGRANT LABOURS

The students of the Department of Social Work at Kristu Jayanti College initiated this research with the goal of creating an awareness of child safety, mobilizing resources for the migrant workers for nutritional supplements, and providing supplementary nutrition to the children.

The K. Narayanpura slum, in the neighbourhood of the College was the site of a survey conducted by students of Kristu Jayanti College, using a quantitative technique in the form of a questionnaire. Understanding the economic situation of migrant workers, their health and hygiene, and the safety of migrant children were the key goals of this study. The research was conducted with the aim of understanding and analysing the correlation between health and sanitary conditions prevalent among the migrant community. As the migrant workers' economic situation was unstable, there was a lack of access to nourishing food. The students mobilised around 20,000 rupees through crowd funding and distributed nutritious kits and sanitary supplies to the 22 migrant families. Young girls in the community learned to use sanitary napkins instead of cloth. Child safety lessons that equips children with age-appropriate knowledge, abilities, and self-esteem were also conducted so they may actively participate in their own security. The sessions taught children that nobody has the right to touch them inappropriately because their body is solely theirs. The researchers were able to witness better health conditions and hygiene practices among the children of migrant labourers after this action project.

PROJECT 7: ACTION RESEARCH ON "HEALTH AND SAFETY AMONG MIGRANT CONSTRUCTION WORKERS"

The students of the Department of Social Work at Kristu Jayanti College implemented this research with the goal of identifying the challenges faced by migrant construction workers during the pandemic, especially the health and environmental conditions of the migrant construction workers, and creating awareness of various health and safety benefits. To better understand the circumstances of migrant workers and the effects of the COVID-19 epidemic on health and safety conditions, the students visited four construction sites in Bangalore. The researchers interacted with all types of construction workers and labourers at several construction sites to observe their work styles and lifestyles. The students were successful in raising Rs. 15,600 to help the community. According to their analysis, the majority of migrant workers were uneducated or had discontinued schooling due to financial difficulties, family obligations or immediate employment possibilities. According to an analysis of the causes of migration, the employees came from various parts of the nation either in pursuit of a job or were compelled to migrate to meet their basic needs.

The students of Kristu Jayanti College sought to provide basic healthcare by getting the elderly parents of the migrant construction workers vaccinated through their association with the Project Manager at the neighboring Government run Primary Health Centre. Essential needs of the migrant labourers, such as blankets, bed sheets, clothing and food, were also provided.

Suman , (i) Consultant, Adult Psychiatry Unit 2 ,(ii) Consultant, Trauma Recovery Clinic, NCWB, (iii) Chairperson, Internal Complaints Committee, NIMHANS , on Malnourishment and its impact on mental health among girl children

The main focus of this program is in line with the UNSDG GOAL 3 of Good Health and Wellbeing which emphasises on creating awareness about the importance of mental health. The program proved to be a medium to create awareness among young girl children on the need to have mental health for well-being.



Learning Outcomes:







Brief Report:


The seminar was well coordinated with the efforts of the faculty members of the Department of Economics and Social Work.

Brief write up:

The United Nations Academic Impact Hub for SDG-1, Kristu Jayanti College (Autonomous) observed United Nations Day on 24 October 2022 by organizing an EQUIZ for undergraduate and postgraduate students. United Nations Day, on 24 October, marks the anniversary of the entry into force in 1945 of the UN Charter. On 31 October 1947, the UN General Assembly, by resolution (168 ((II)), declared that the Day would be devoted to raising awareness of the goals and achievements of the Organization and gaining support for its work. In 1971, the Assembly recommended that UN Day be observed as a public holiday by all Member States (resolution 2782 (XXVI)). With the ratification of this founding document by the majority of its signatories, including the five permanent members of the Security Council, the United Nations officially came into being.

The EQUIZ was conducted with the aid of a Google Form. The questions for the quiz were taken by the faculty members. The topics were based on status of poverty in India taken by Dr Rakhi, Status of poverty around the globe questions taken by Dr Sruthi and United Nations and SDG impact questions taken by Dr Lyola Thomas. The total marks for the quiz was 30. The Google Form link was shared with the students on 24th October. Students from the different deaneries of Humanities, Commerce and Management and Life participated enthusiastically in the quiz. Overall 292 students participated in the quiz.





Rural Exposure-Making the invisible visible

The Department of Media Studies PG, KristuJayanti College UNAI Hub for SDG-1 in association with the center for service learning and the Department of Media Studies (PG) organized a 2-days campaign on 'Clean Water and Sanitation in Kaiwara Village, Chintamani Taluk of Chikkaballapura District in Karnataka on 17 & 18 November 2022, providing an opportunity for the students to gain hands-on experience and practical skills while being exposed to rural areas.

The commemoration of **SDG -6** took place as the students carried out a Two-day Clean Water and Sanitation Campaign with the purpose of 'Making the invisible visible. 13 students were accompanied by 2 faculty members who together explored various areas of the Kaiwara village. A Two-day itinerary was planned out which was executed once the Jayantians reached the Sri Yogi Narayana Mutt, where their food and accommodation were taken care of.

The first day started with an interaction with the PRO of the Mutt Mr. T L Anand, who gave a detailed historical significance of Kaiwara and the mutt that we were staying at. After the interaction, the Jayantians visited the Government High School, Kaiwara. Here the batch of only 13 students was divided into three groups where each group was assigned a particular topic and



activity to carry out. Keeping the campaign and purpose of the visit, the students carried out an awareness campaign on clean water, hygiene, and sanitation which included a skit. While one team performed the skit while the other two teams engaged the students with sustainable art and craft activity and exercises on English grammar. Soon after this, the students went into different village areas based on their teams and interacted with the villagers while carrying out a survey that was required for their field of study.

The second day was concentrated on visiting places of significance which included a trek up the Kaiwara Hill, NarasimhaSwamy Temple, Antargange Hills, and Caves, and not forget the visit to the College of Sericulture, Chintamani. Two professors of the College were allotted as guides who walked the students through the whole process of how silk is harvested and made into silk sarees. From the plantations to worms forming the cocoons, to the weaving of the silk in the machines was all shown step by step. Through this, the students acquired knowledge on the types of silkworms and the type of silk they produce, and much more. One of the most interesting parts of this tour was seeing how every single thing was made use of- for instance, dry cocoons were made into beautiful crafts such as the Ganesha idol, flowers, jewelry, etc.

This trip was not only informative but it also proved to be a much-needed break from the monotonous routine that the students had. It gave them a chance to engage in learning outside their classroom. The survey they carried out impacted their research and analytical skills. Such trips become a part of the core memory that the Jayantians would carry along even after their college life.
